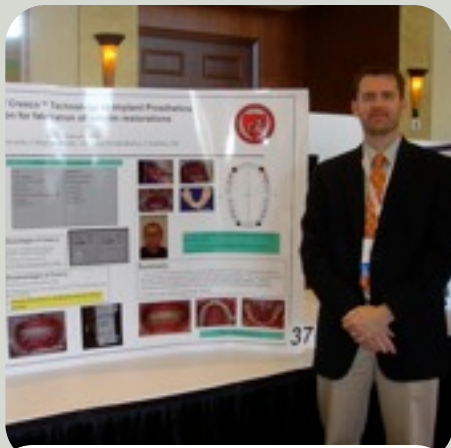

Ohio State residents make a great showing at national meetings, win grant awards

ACP Annual meeting, Scottsdale AZ

Third year resident Jason Peacock presented a table clinic entitled "Use of CRESCO technology for Implant Prosthetics: Fabrication of Interim restorations" at the 2007 ACP annual meeting in Scottsdale AZ. The poster was well received due to the cutting edge laser technology introduced by AstraTech Dental called Cresco. This novel technique ensures a passive framework fit in multi-unit applications and allows angulation of the screw-access holes up to 17°, thereby eliminating the need for angled abutments. American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics Annual meeting, Chicago IL

Second year resident Pakawat Chatriyanuyoke also gave a table clinic entitled "Opaquers for fixed-complete, metal-resin implant-supported dental prostheses" at a

national annual meeting, the American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics in Chicago, IL. His poster was about the new XP Dent "SilanoPen" used with pink and tooth-colored opaquer that were recently introduced to increase the bond between alloys and acrylic resin, as well as mask the dark color of a metal framework.

European Academy of Osseointegration, Barcelona, Spain

Dr. Jason Peacock, a third-year resident, and Dr. Dexter Flemming, former OMFS resident, won the O.S.U. Astra Tech dental implant "Posterior Challenge" competition. Sponsored by Astra Tech, residents and implant clinic fellows were invited to present patient treatments involving Astra implants in the posterior region of the mouth. Their presentation showed the rehabilitation of their patient with a cleft lip/palate, using dental implants to replace the mandibular posterior dentition and the entire maxillary dentition. They were sponsored for a trip to present their work at the European Academy of Osseointegration meeting in Barcelona, Spain.

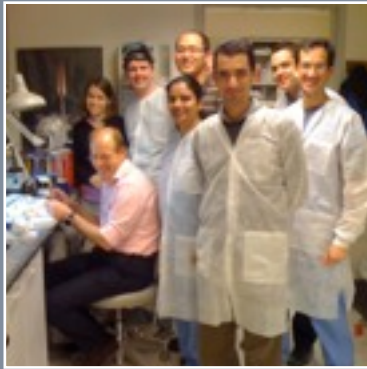
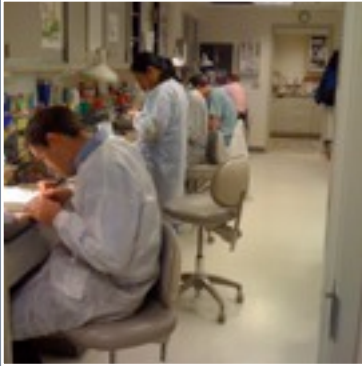
Academy of Osseointegration Clinical Charitable Grant

Congratulations to Drs. Holloway and Peacock for procuring a sizable charitable grant for a patient in need. The Graduate Prosthodontics program was awarded a Patient Care grant from the Osseointegration Foundation to provide treatment for an edentulous patient with a rare disease, Dominant Dystrophic Epidermolysis Bullosa. Epidermolysis bullosa is a group of inherited bullous disorders characterized by blister formation in response to mechanical trauma. Despite their best efforts, many patients with Epidermolysis bullosa develop dental caries because of enamel defects. In addition, significant oral mucosal involvement can accompany severe forms of this disease, making it difficult or impossible to wear conventional dentures. The Ohio State University College of Dentistry Graduate Prosthodontics and Graduate Periodontics programs will receive narrative recognition at all opportunities (i.e. at official Academy meetings), and visual recognition in several forums, including: Academy News; the Academy Bulletin Board in the International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Implants; and the Osseointegration Foundation Report.

Foundation for Ectodermal Dysplasias Clinical Grant

Congratulations to Dr. Brent Rigby, a second-year Advanced Prosthodontics resident, for securing a grant from the National Foundation for Ectodermal Dysplasias on behalf of one of his patients who has this syndrome. Ectodermal dysplasias are a group of 150 inheritable disorders that affects the ectoderm, often resulting in abnormal or absent tooth development, sparse hair, and inability to sweat. This grant will allow his patient to receive dental implant-supported prostheses and a smile she that was born without.
